


Let's do good together.

They started locally, but knew their work was important for all communities and developed "Self Esteem Rising" which launched them to a national level, helping women and girls throughout the country. My Name is Jeffrey Behounek and I am a branch manager for Meadowbrook Financial Mortgage Bankers Corp. This past year has been extremely hard on

families throughout the world. On top of the financial and health issues that arose from the pandemic, there have been other things on the rise in the darkest corners of our society. Domestic Violence right now in our local communities is increasing at an astonishing rate. Most of us know someone that has been a victim of domestic violence and the pandemic has made things significantly worse, confining people within their homes, forcing direct contact with their abusers. The Retreat of East Hampton is on the front lines working to combat these horrific tales.

The Retreat's mission is to provide safety, shelter, and support for victims of domestic abuse and to break the cycle of family violence.

In pursuit of that mission, The Retreat provides direct services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault, their families, and the Eastern Long Island community through a 24-hour bilingual hot-line, counseling, legal advocacy, prevention education, & emergency shelter. Violence prevention education and other supportive programs are available in Nassau and Suffolk Counties. One hundred percent of donations and proceeds will go directly to The Hance Foundation, The Retreat of East Hampton, and event sponsoring.

(Disabled/Homeless Veteran Support)

Mission Helping Hands has partnered with Veteran organizations in Nassau County to help provide assistance to our local Veterans. We are asking local businesses and community leaders to help with donation funding for this important cause. Through the donations received, Veterans will be provided with new jackets, shoes, clothes and non-perishable foods. These items are essential in helping our less fortunate Veterans in Nassau County.

Nassau County is home to nearly 60,000 Veterans, and Mission Helping Hands is currently, as it has done in the past, providing direct assistance to our local Veterans by supporting the "Veterans Homeless Stand Down" event. This event is conducted in coordination with many Veteran groups and charitable nonprofit organizations in the local area. The event is conducted twice per year at the Freeport Armory and is free of charge to all Veterans. The mission of the Veterans Stand Down event is to

Provide essential critical services to our less fortunate Veterans and to inform them of what services they are entitled to.

The Veterans Stand Down allows Veterans the opportunity to receive all services provided at one location free of charge. The services provided at the event are intended

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to help, aid, and assist any Veteran in need.

On **September 18th**, at Brew SA Brewery, we will be hosting a fundraising event to help support this cause.

Live music, food, and soft drinks will be provided for one cover charge at the door. A cash bar will also be available if you would like to purchase alcoholic beverages.

Additionally, we will have raffle tickets available for purchase. Proceeds from this event will be donated to the Veterans Supportive Stand Down Events.

On October 2nd, Mission Helping Hands will be hosting a Pub crawl starting on Bell Boulevard to benefit the Cawley Foundation in honor of Firefighter Michael Cawley who lost his life 20 years ago. All proceeds raised will benefit the Michael J. Cawley Memorial Foundation.

Michael Cawley was one of the 343 New York City firefighters that heroically lost their lives at the WTC on September 11th, 2001. The Firefighter Michael J. Cawley Memorial Foundation was established in early 2002 to honor and remember him.

Michael was someone who was always there to help those in need. The foundation has established 3 scholarships for the children of NYC Firefighters who wish to attend Archbishop Molloy HS. To date, over 57 students have been awarded Michael's scholarship. The foundation has also aided a camp for adults & children with special needs in Eusopus, NY, where Michael volunteered as a counselor. Ten campers every summer attend tuition-free, paid for through the foundation.

Other work the foundation has been involved in includes aid to FDNY families that were affected by Super Storm Sandy, helping first responders who have been diagnosed with WTC related cancer, and providing support to FDNY family members with special needs.

My name is Victoria Farrell. This year on my

24th birthday I will be celebrating by giving back to a charity that is very meaningful to me, The Herren Project. They are an organization whose mission is to support, inspire, and empower those affected by substance use disorder. Their goal is to bring positive awareness to the disease of addiction.

So far, they have provided treatment placement assistance to nearly 3,000 recovering addicts.

Currently, the opioid epidemic is at a historic high with hundreds of people dying each year to an opioid related overdose. Throughout my entire life, addiction has affected my family in many ways. My aunt struggled for years with an opioid addiction and thankfully, with the help of Narcotics Anonymous and multiple rehabilitation stays, she is over 8 years clean and sober. Unfortunately, my cousin Amanda was not as lucky and lost a long battle to addiction in 2015, just a few weeks before her 21st birthday. Her death was one of the most influential events in my life. Ever since this day, I have spent my life trying to make her proud, honor her name, and do everything I can to make sure that nobody else will ever have to feel the pain my family felt. It has been difficult for me to find people who understand my pain and how serious the opioid epidemic truly is.

When I started working at Meadowbrook Financial, I met my best friend Alexis. Alexis and her family went through a similar situation with her brother Anthony, who lost his battle to addiction very young as well. At Mission Helping Hands we are committed to helping combat this disease by partnering with The Herren Project. On **October 14th**, Mission Helping Hands, Gia

Lynch, and myself, will be hosting a **golf outing at North Hills Country Club** in honor of Amanda and Anthony, and all of the proceeds will be donated to The Herren Project in their memory. I thank everyone who decides to come and contribute.
